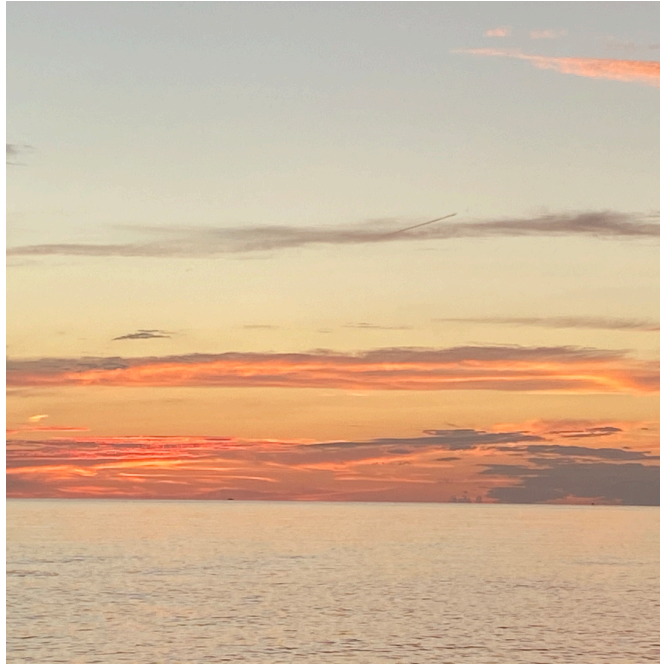

GOLDEN BEACH NEWSLETTER JULY 2020
